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Based on more than 25 years of research interest in Bislama, and after the publication of three dictionaries (Crowley 1990, 1995, 2003) and a grammatical account of Bislama written in Bislama (Crowley 1987) the late Terry Crowley's Bislama Reference Grammar is the first attempt towards a comprehensive grammatical description of this language.

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During this time Bislama fully established its vocabulary and grammar. It appears not to have changed very significantly during the next 100 years. As recruits returned home to the Solomon Islands and Papua New Guinea, the distinctive features of Bislama's sister dialects, Tok Pisin in Papua New Guinea and Pidjin in the Solomons, began to emerge.

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While the influence of these vernacular languages is low on the vocabulary side, it is very high in the morphosyntax. Bislama can be basically described as a language with an English vocabulary and an Oceanic grammar.

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
