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I See I Understand I

See can be used figuratively to mean understand. One of Merriam-Webster's definitions of see is "to perceive the meaning or importance of : understand" (definition 3b). For example, if someone explains something to you and you say, "I see," you mean that you understand the explanation.

phrases - Difference between I see and I understand ...

"I see." is informal, and is often used by friends talking to each other. The original poster is correct that "I understand" is more formal than "I see", and that both "I understand" and "I see" are often used by doctors who are listening to patients. If you are not being sarcastic, you could say: "I understand." (from the original post.)
