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prevalence is associated with growing rates of preventable complications and premature mortality, resulting in soaring costs (box 1). 2 3 4 5 These factors, coupled with higher expectations among patients and the public, 6 create an urgent need to redesign health services, which are still largely geared to providing episodic acute care. 7 8
